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Snap-on Driver Kurt Busch Wins NASCAR Sprint Cup Race at Sonoma

Penske Driver Fourth in Points Standings with First Win of Season

KENOSHA, **Wis.** – **June 27**, **2011** – Snap-on sponsored driver Kurt Busch won his first race of the season with a victory at the NASCAR Sprint Cup 350 held on June 26 at the Infineon Raceway in Sonoma, Calif. With the win, Busch is now fourth in the Sprint Cup season point standings.

Pedregon and the Snap-on Funny Car reached the semifinals for the third race in a row, and sixth time in 2011, at the NHRA Nationals in Norwalk, Ohio over the weekend to keep a solid hold on fourth in the point standings. Although the NHRA will not be racing over the Fourth of July weekend, Cruz and his brother Tony Pedregon will be, as they plan to participate in a match race on July 1 at Raceway Park in Lancaster, N.Y. The next day, Cruz and Tony will head to Canada's Cayuga Dragway to take part in another match race as part of the Canadian Nitro Nationals at the Toronto Motorsports Park on July 2.
