## **Safety Signal Words**

Risk of Personal Injury and Equipment Damage - **Tipping Hazards** 

- Do not use on uneven, rough, wet or slippery floors.
- Avoid using the unit near heavy moving equipment that could hit the cart and tip it over.
- Do not climb, sit or stand on the unit.
- Do not lift unit.
- Do not move, or roll the unit in a unsafe manner.
  Only move/roll at a slow controlled pace.
- Do not move the unit if the casters are damaged or not working properly. Replace damaged casters before operation.
- Do not pull any items (tools, cables, etc.) that are hanging from the unit that could catch or hook something and pull the cart over.
- Do not open more than one loaded drawer at a time
- Close and lock drawers before moving.
- Apply brakes on locking casters when unit is stationary.
- If unit begins to tip, stand clear
- Do not open any drawer with swivel caster positioned inward
- Do not step in or on drawers
- Do not use any open drawer as support or leverage
- Do not attach items, tools, machinery, etc to the unit.
- Disconnect or unplug all power cord and cable assemblies before moving unit.

Tipping over of the unit, or the unit striking you can cause personal injury and equipment damage.

Risk of Personal Injury - Tripping Hazards

- Disconnect or unplug all power cords and diagnostic tool cables before moving the unit.
- · Shut all drawers when not in use.
- Do not hang items, cables, tools, from the unit that could catch or entangle you or someone else.
- Be aware or your surroundings when the unit's power cable is connected to a receptacle, and when cables are connected between the unit, diagnostic tool and vehicle.
- Be sure that the power cord and any cables attached to your tools, equipment, and other accessories are routed so as not to interfere with walk paths, and will not be tripped over or pulled.
- Ensure all cables are secured and routed in a manner, avoiding excessive slack/looping. Use cable ties as needed.

Tripping over the unit or cables can cause personal injury.

#### **WARNING**

- Connect the power strip to a single receptacle only, do not overload the MAINS circuit.
- Do not remove the ground connection from the power cord. The power cord must be connected to 110VAC 60hz grounded receptacle.

- Do not operate with a damaged cord or plug.

# Unpacking and Removing from Pallet

- Carefully remove all straps, cardboard, wrapping, and packaging materials from the Diagnostic Mobile Workcenter.
  - For shipping purposes the touch screen display is placed in the rear apron area, and all other components including the ZEUS diagnostic tool are placed in the toolbox drawers.
- 2. Remove the touch screen display from the workcenter and set it aside in a safe place.
- 3. Remove all components from the toolbox drawers and set them aside in a safe place. Close and latch the toolbox drawers.

# **MARNING**

#### **Risk of Personal Injury**

 Do not lift the workcenter off the pallet. Using two people and the ramp provided, carefully roll the workcenter off the pallet.

Lifting heavy objects can cause personal injury.

# **Adjusting the Tray Height**

The worktop tray may be adjusted to your height preference. It is recommend that you adjust the tray height **BEFORE** installing the display. SeeTray Height Adjustment (optional) on page 3.

# **Display Installation**

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Tighten all screws securely. Do not overtighten threaded fasteners.
- To avoid damage, handle all components with care.
- Protect all surfaces during assembly to avoid scratching or marring the finish.
- · Additional display mounting screws may be provided for different display manufacturers. Use the applicable screws for the display provided with your unit.
- 1. Locate the following parts included with your workcenter:
  - (1) Display Bracket
  - (1) Display Tilt Bracket
  - (1) 27" Touch Screen Display
  - (4) M4 X 12mm Phillips Head Screws (display bracket to display)
  - (8) M6 X 12mm Phillips Head Screws (display bracket to tilt bracket and tilt bracket to main mount)
  - (4) M6 Flat Washers
  - (4) M4 Split Ring Washers
  - (8) M6 Split Ring Washers
- 2. Set the display down on a safe padded surface.
- 3. Attach the display bracket to the display using four M4 x 12mm Phillips head screws and M4 split ring washer as shown in Figure 3. NOTE: Multiple holes are provided in the display bracket for universal installation. Use the applicable mount position for your application.



4. Attach the display tilt bracket to the display bracket using four M6 x 12mm Phillips head screws. Install M6 flat washer and M6 split ring washer on each

screw, split washers between screw and flat washer as shown in Figure 4.




Remove the five Phillips head screws, and the rear cover Figure 5. For clarity, component cables and power supplies are not shown in the following illustrations.



6. Carefully hang the display on the main mount as shown in Figure 6.



7. Attach the display tilt bracket to the main mount using four M6 x 12mm Phillips head screws and M6 split ring washer as shown in *Figure 7*.



8. Install the rear cover using the five Phillips head screws removed prior (*Figure 8*).



9. Connect the Power, HDMI and USB cables to the display (*Figure* 9).



- 10. Connect the display and diagnostic tool AC power cables to the AC power strip.
- 11. Plug the AC power strip into a grounded AC 120V/60Hz power supply outlet, then turn the AC power strip on.

# **Tray Height Adjustment (optional)**

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Do not overtighten threaded fasteners.
- To avoid damage, handle all components with care.
- Protect all surfaces during assembly to avoid scratching or marring the finish.
- 1. Remove all loose items from the tray.
- 2. Remove the touch screen display.
- 3. Remove the applicable protective caps from the workcenter side panels (*Figure 10*).
- 4. Using a 4 mm hex wrench, loosen the four tray mounting screws.
- 5. With the assistance of a helper to hold and support the tray, remove the screws and move the tray to the desired height.

- 6. Install and tighten the screws to secure the tray in the new position.
- 7. Install all protective caps that were removed.
- 8. Reinstall the touch screen display as described in Display Installation on page 2.



# **Diagnostic Tool Setup**

- Install the battery pack into the diagnostic tool. Refer to the diagnostic tool *User Manual* for detailed instructions, visit: http://diagnostics.snapon.com/usermanuals.
- 2. Insert the diagnostic tool into the docking station (*Figure 11*).

3. Remove the keyboard and mouse from their packaging. **Note:** Refer to the installation instructions provided with the keyboard and mouse for detailed operating instructions.

- 4. Remove the battery insulator strips from both the mouse and keyboard, then turn them both on.
- 5. Turn the display on, then turn the diagnostic tool on and allow it to complete its boot up process.

Refer to the diagnostic tool *User Manual* for detailed operation instructions.

# Adjusting the Display Settings (If Required)

The diagnostic tool display settings are preset from the factory for use with the external display. Adjustment is not required, however if needed use these instructions to reset the display settings.

 From the Windows<sup>®</sup> desktop taskbar, select the Intel<sup>®</sup> HD Graphic Icon (Figure 12), then select Graphic Properties from the menu.

3. Select **Digital Television** from the Select Display menu (*Figure 15*).



- 10. Select Maintain Display Scaling (Figure 18).




